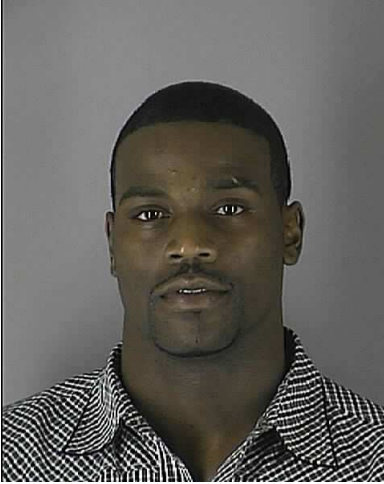

Four suspects added to Hennepin County's Top Ten Most Wanted List

March 10, 2011 (MINNEAPOLIS) – Four suspects have been added to Hennepin County's Top Ten Most Wanted List. Hennepin County Sheriff Rich Stanek is asking the public for information that will help lead to their arrests.

"I have been impressed with how the citizens of Hennepin County have responded with helpful tips and information when we ask for their help about a crime or a fugitive," said Hennepin County Sheriff Rich Stanek. "I encourage people to call us if they can provide even one piece of the puzzle that would lead to an arrest."

The four new suspects who were added to the Most Wanted List are wanted on active warrants in unrelated cases and they include the suspects listed.



Valentino Deangelo Clay

- He is wanted on a warrant in connection with a drive-by shooting incident
- In 2010, he shot a man in Minneapolis. He fired a gun from the sunroof of a vehicle. Clay was charged with felony drive-by shooting.
- He is a black male
- Height: 6'01"
- Weight: 189
- He has black hair and brown eyes
- Age: 21
- Charging agency: Minneapolis Police Department



Andrew Lee Durant

- He is wanted on a warrant in connection with a burglary charge.
- He is a Native American male
- Height: 5'08"
- Weight: 166
- He has black hair and brown eyes
- Age: 22
- Charging agency: Minneapolis Police Department



Julian Alcaide Lopez

- He is wanted on a warrant related to criminal sexual conduct
- In 2002, he was charged with the sexual assault of a 14-year-old girl in Bloomington
- He is an Hispanic male
- Height: 5'4"
- Weight: 135
- He has brown hair and brown eyes
- Age: 35
- Charging agency: Bloomington Police Department



Julie Marie Cahlaway

- She is wanted on a warrant related to identity theft.
- She is an Asian female
- Height: 5'04"
- Weight: 98
- She has black hair and brown eyes
- Age: 31
- Charging agency: Edina Police Department

How do citizens provide tips to the Sheriff's Office?

These fugitives should be considered armed and dangerous. Do not approach them or attempt to apprehend them. To provide tips, please contact your local law enforcement agency or call the Hennepin County Sheriff's Office tip line, **1-888-988-TIPS**. Tipsters may call **Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS** or they may send information via a text message or an online form. Instructions for both are available on the Crime Stoppers website. (www.crimestoppersmn.org). If your information to Crime Stoppers results in the arrest of one of these individuals, you may receive a cash reward of up to \$1000 and Crime Stoppers won't even ask your name.

The public is urged to provide information about any of the people on Hennepin County's Top Ten Most Wanted List. The entire list may be viewed on the Sheriff's Office website at www.hennepinsheriff.org.

How are suspects selected for Hennepin County's Top Ten Most Wanted List?

The Most Wanted List is intended to engage and inform the public about the search for individuals who are wanted on active warrants. We ask for information from citizens and encourage them to take an active role in public safety in their community.

When selecting suspects for the Most Wanted List, the Sheriff's Office follows the policies and general practices used by the FBI for its Most Wanted List. With that information, the Sheriff's Office established the following guidelines for selection in which the individual meets one or more of the criteria:

- When an individual has committed a serious crime – or the individual is a threat to the community.
- When publicity will be useful in locating a suspect: In some cases, investigators may determine that publicity may be helpful in locating a particular fugitive. Publicity may not be appropriate in some cases or in certain phases of an investigation.
- The Most Wanted List will include suspects who are wanted on a variety of different crimes: The Most Wanted List is an opportunity to educate the public about different types of crimes and new/emerging threats to public safety. The Most Wanted List is only one method to assist law enforcement in publicizing the need to locate wanted individuals. In cases where there is an urgent need to locate a violent suspect and it has been determined that publicity is appropriate, the Sheriff's Office will use a variety of methods to inform the public and request assistance in locating the individual.

Several arrests have created openings on the Most Wanted List. 29-year-old Ronald Ezel Scott of Minneapolis is currently in custody after being featured on the list for several months. He was wanted in connection with a Minneapolis case involving first degree controlled substance and felony false imprisonment.
